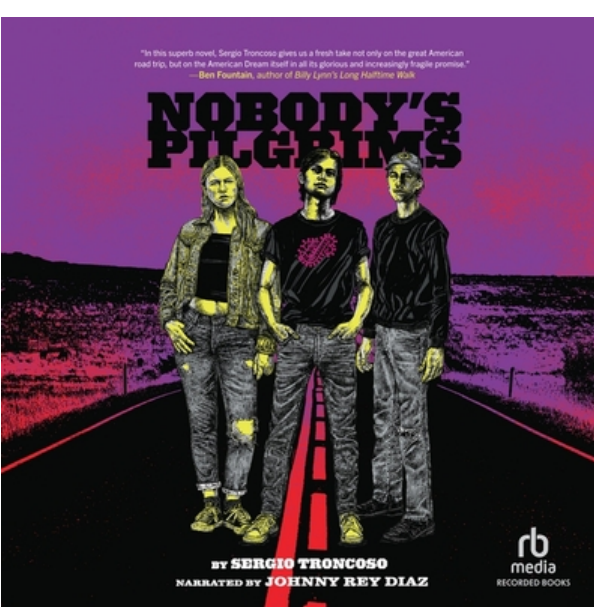
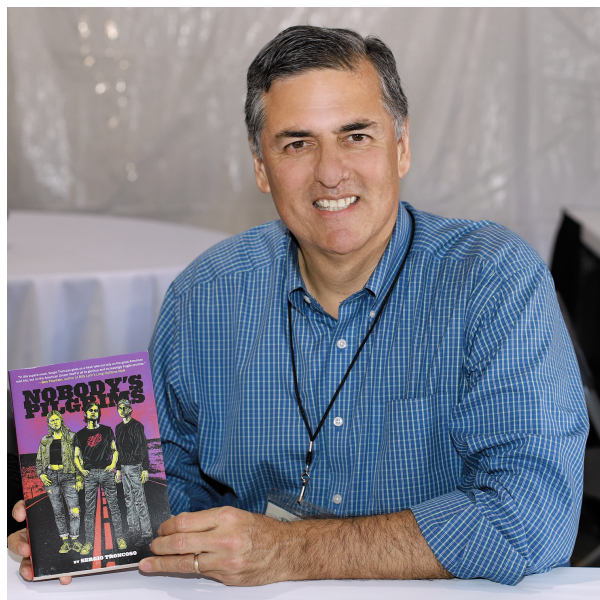

## Congratulations to Sergio Troncoso Inducted into the Texas Literary Hall of Fame

**Scholar Mentor, Sergio Troncoso** is the author of eight books, most recently **Nobody's Pilgrims**, which won the Gold Medal for Best Novel- Adventure or Drama in English from the International Latino Book Awards. He also wrote *A Peculiar Kind of Immigrant's Son*, which Luis Alberto Urrea hailed as "a world-class collection" and Junot Díaz called "a masterwork." Troncoso edited *Nepantla Familias: An Anthology of Mexican American Literature on Families in between Worlds*, which received a starred review from Kirkus Reviews. A Fulbright scholar, Troncoso is past president of the Texas Institute of Letters. He has been teaching at the Yale Writers' Workshop since 2013. His work has appeared in the *Pleiades*, *Yale Review*, *New Letters*, *Other Voices*, *Houston Chronicle*, *Texas Highways*, *Michigan Quarterly Review*, and *Texas Monthly*.

## Coming September 5th: Humanities and Pedagogy: Freud and Jung By Rafael Castillo



**CTN Fellow and Director of Publications Dr. Rafael Castillo**, a professor of English and humanities at **Palo Alto College**, had a recent article, "The Future of the Liberal Arts and the Humanities," published in the June 2024 issue of *Hispanic Outlook on Education Magazine*, the official journal of the American Association of Hispanics in Higher Education (AAHHE).

**Rafael Castillo** and **Alfredo Torres, Jr.**'s collaborative article, "Humanities and Pedagogy: Freud and Jung," is scheduled for publication on September 5, 2024, in NISOD's *Innovative Abstracts* published by the National Institute for Staff and Organizational Development (NISOD), an online journal published by the University of Texas at Austin. Castillo and Torres, Jr. are both NISOD Teaching Excellent recipients and have team-taught the 1302 Humanities course at Palo Alto College. Professor Torres, Jr. also teaches Humanities at Alamo Colleges and Austin Community Colleges.

Alfredo Torres, Jr., and Rafael Castillo, PhD, delivered a "Pedagogy and the Humanities" workshop at the October 13, 2023, Conference in Austin, sponsored by the **National Community College Humanities Association (CCHA)**. The presentation focused on Sigmund Freud and Carl Jung and using film as a basis for critical analysis. (the NISOD article is based on that presentation). In addition, Alfredo Torres had a fiction piece published in the 2022 issue of *CCH Humanities Review* titled "The Sacrifice." Professor Torres, a CTN executive copy editor, is currently doing research for Oxford University Press.

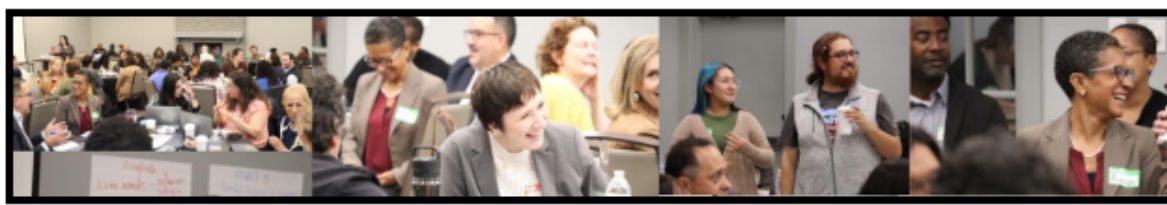

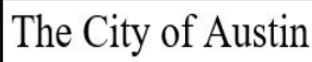
