## Culture Event- Ascender Students at South Texas College- Starr Campus



As part of a cultural event at South Texas University, acclaimed author and Ascender professor Juan Ochoa presented his latest novel, Pa'l Otro Lado, at the STC Starr Campus on September 5th. A prequel to his previous work, Mariguano, Pa'l Otro Lado chronicles five generations of the Cortina family as they endure violence, forced migration, and the harsh pursuit of survival. Ochoa artfully captures the struggles that drive these characters, revealing how hunger and poverty can overshadow the pursuit of the American Dream. Through rich characterizations and poignant storytelling, Pa'l Otro Lado highlights such hardships' emotional and psychological tolls, inviting readers to empathize with those caught in cycles of struggle and hope.







Juan Ochoa's words resonated deeply, inspiring students to reflect on their family experiences and cultural identities. Through this interaction, Ochoa emphasized the importance of storytelling in honoring and preserving personal and communal histories.

A key highlight of the event was Ochoa's dynamic engagement with students. He encouraged them to write their own stories and preserve their histories.

## **Features of the Month**



**Stacy Ybarra Evans, Ed.D.,** is an innovative educator and dedicated academic leader with a passion for student success. With extensive administrative experience, she has led transformative projects, such as implementing diversity initiatives and advancing online learning. Stacy's commitment to excellence in education is evident in her various roles and contributions to fostering a culture of learning and growth.

In her recent publication over the summer, Stacy Ybarra Evans authored a chapter titled

"Empowering Faculty Vitality and Mitigating Burnout Through Generative AI in Higher Education" as part of the book Transforming Education With Generative AI: Prompt Engineering and Synthetic Content Creation (2024). Evans comprehensively analyzes how generative AI can transform educational environments, providing innovative approaches to alleviate faculty burnout while promoting sustained vitality. Her work emphasizes the critical role of AI in fostering resilient and adaptive teaching practices within higher education.

Currently serving as the Director of the Center for Teaching Excellence at Our Lady of the Lake University, she spearheads initiatives to enhance pedagogical practices and support faculty development. Stacy holds a Doctorate in Educational Leadership from Capella University and has a rich academic background, including degrees from Texas A&M University and Alamo Colleges District.



Anavey Perez has been a Catch the Next Ascender student for almost two years and serves as the president of the Ascender club. In August, she won the Alamo Promise Student of the Month award. Anavey accepted this award and gave a speech at the August District Board meeting. Nine years ago, Anavey However, reality quickly set in, and she was forced to accept that Pace University would not be affordable. She then set out to go to UTSA, utilizing scholarships and grants, but again, even with scholarships, the university was not affordable. It was then that she chose to attend Palo Alto College.

"I never envisioned that I would be here today. I enrolled at Palo Alto College as a nontraditional student, a single mother of a small child, experiencing homelessness, and returning to an academic environment after a 7-year time gap. Through a youth opportunity organization called NXT LEVEL, I was assisted in enrolling in Palo Alto College and the AlamoPROMISE Program," she said.

"Through my own experience, I have been able to influence the attendance of 5 immediate family members to graduated from South San Antonio High School as the first person in her family to receive a high school diploma. She graduated with honors and scholarships, and, as the President of the Student Council, she spoke at the graduation ceremony. She was bound to New York as she wanted to attend Pace University. enroll at Palo Alto College to work towards their academic and career goals. Today, I represent the success of a program like AlamoPROMISE and its impact on a minority, nontraditional student. I stand before you today as a licensed cosmetologist and an associate's degree holder who can now build financial stability and provide a better quality of life for my daughter Nylah, myself, and my family. None of this would be possible without the AlamoPROMISE program. The AlamoPROMISE program promises future leaders that success is possible through hard work and dedication," she added.







### Advising Students with Disabilities

The Texas OnCourse team is excited to announce the next Professional Learning Series session that will focus on advising students with disabilities. Helping students with disabilities transition into adulthood requires careful planning and community support to ensure students have the skills and services needed to be successful. 
